The child care is fully staffed once again! We are very excited to welcome bringing a wealth of experience to both the infant and toddler rooms.

We currently have 7 infants enrolled with the 8<sup>th</sup> slot reserved for a teen p the 7, three are children of teen parents and four are staff members' child bit of turnover in enrollment. We currently have three full time children e children; all of BPS staff. We are in the process of establishing a wrap-aro childcare after school for children up to the age of 5 years.

Both classrooms are fully furnished with lots of new toys, materials and furniture thanks to the generous support of the Blackfeet ManPower. Our "big room" is also developing into an environment supporting gross motor development and social emotional learning opportunities.

We have started the long process of license renewal so the staff are very busy completing required trainings online. We are rotating staff through the training to balance supervision of children and staff training time.



## TEEN PARENT PROGRAM

We are currently actively working with 7 teen parents. We are doing outreach to an additional 16 teen parents. Once we make contact with the other 16, we will be able to provide supportive services to assist them with attending school.

#### HI-SET

The Hi-Set program has had 5 students return this Fall and four new students have enrolled. We are also starting to receive new referrals from both the high school and the Academy. Students being referred are generally severely credit deficient in respect to their age (ie. 17 years old with one credit).

We are excited to share that, over the summer, we had two students complete the program. One student successfully passed his Hi-Set example and the other student was awarded an Honorary High School diploma.

The FIT program started the school year at a full sprint. Our program hosted the first ever "Back to School Store," which was a huge success! We were able to provide school supplies to every student in need in grades PreK-6<sup>th</sup>, as well as several students in BMS, BHS and the Academy. ## ATTENDANCE MATTERS

We had our first district wide attendance committee on September 17, 2019. Each building was represented, as well as staff members from Blackfeet Tribal court. During this meeting, the committee reviewed our process for completing court referrals for truancy. At the next meeting, we will look specifically at what each building does for attendance support prior to completing a court referral. The ultimate goal of the Attendance Committee is to improve our attendance district-wide.
