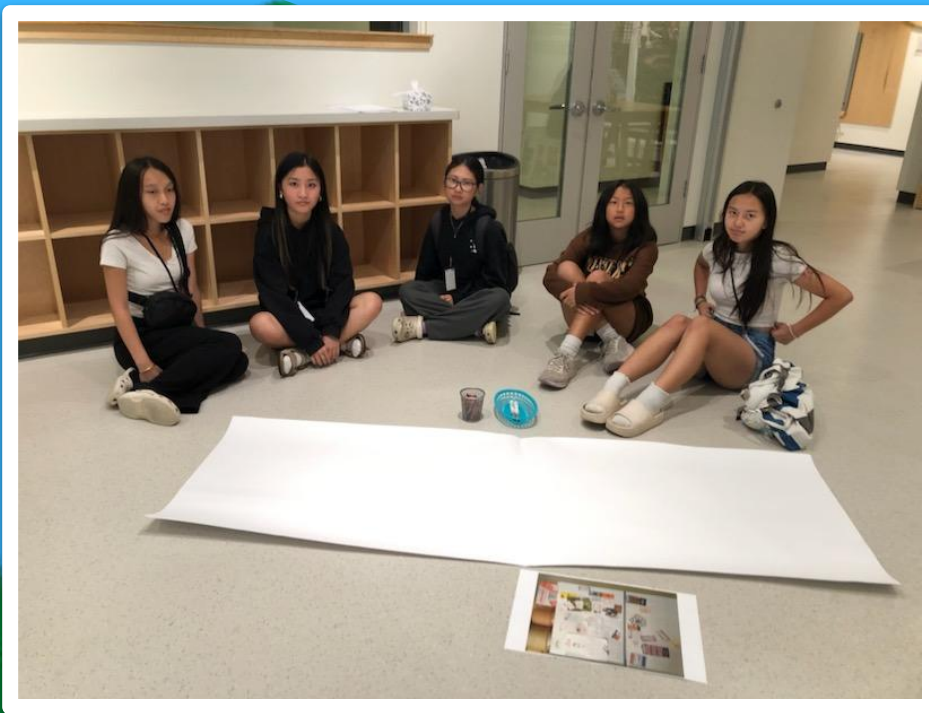


Hmong Phoojywg Enrichment Program
