Did any of our elementary or middle school campuses (excluding special populations or subsets) meet or exceed the state's average of students who did meet the grade level average percent (opposite of percent who did not meet grade level in the TEA summary)? If so, please identify those campuses.

Since students in 5th and 8th grade were first tested in the April STAAR administration (Reading and Math), Did students who successfully took the re-test in Reading and Math (second administration) increase the percent of students for any campus who did meet the grade level percent? If so, please identify those campuses and their updated meet grade level percentages. With those increases, did any of our elementary or middle school campuses meet or exceed the state's average of students who did meet the grade level average percent? If so, please identify those campuses.

All of the elementary and middle school campus' cumulative results increased. Two campuses exceeded the State's final cumulative Math results of 89%, they are:

Palo Alto - 5th gr Math @ 90%

Price - 5th gr Math @ 90%

(**NOTE: Cumulative scores for elementary schools are both the English & Spanish versions of STAAR from the April and May administrations)

4. For those middle school students (8th grade) who took the Algebra I STAAR test, are those results retained to the middle school campus? Or are the Algebra I results included with the high school Algebra I results?

All Spring 2019 8th gr Algebra I test results factor into the middle schools' accountability rating.

5. With most STAAR testing complete, there are some school districts who are predicting their school district letter grade academic rating, as well as, their individual campus letter grade academic ratings.
