Topics and Information Presented/Discussed:

Dr. Thomas introduced Attorney Judy Brown of Walsh, Anderson, Brown, Gallegos & Green, P.C. in Austin, Texas; and Leslie Johnston of Johnston & Associates in Tow, Texas.

Ms. Brown explained the need for redistricting and the guidelines for the process. Ms. Johnston reviewed the trustee multi-member election districts, other changes to the trustee election system, and redistricting options.

The RAC members considered two draft plans, Plan 2-A and Plan 2-B, provided by the demographer. The RAC members agreed that having easily identifiable boundaries would be important for voters' understanding of the new plan and for the administration of elections under the new plan.

All RAC members unanimously agreed that the 2-B plan created better boundaries and created two multimember districts with an even percentage of Hispanic population at 66.3% each.

John Galloway was appointed Committee Chair.

No further meetings were necessary as the committee was in total agreement.
