The Three Rivers School District fully supports student led conferencing and this will be our second year hosting this exciting couple of days. I will be sharing more in regards to this process over the next couple of months.

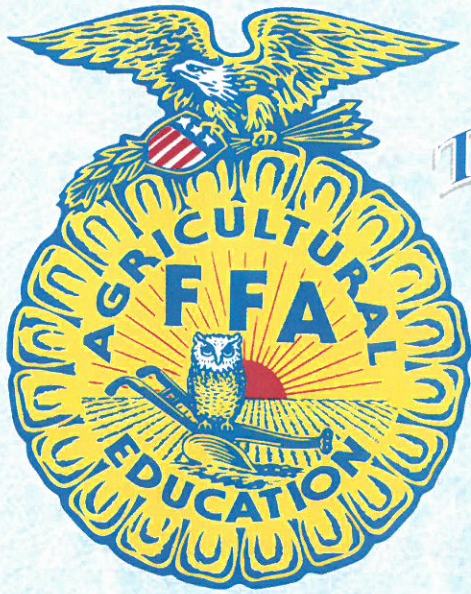
Our Friday late starts have been valuable time where our staff has been working on trauma informed care and collaboration within professional learning communities. These sessions are proving to be beneficial to the teaching and learning in our school. As potentials for improved instruction and assessment are set for our teachers, the expectations for our students remain high. Quality classroom instruction and assessment are only part of the plan for increasing student learning. Students must be present, on time, focused, prepared with required assignments and materials and engage with the teaching in the classroom so that they can perform. All of this sounds good... but if a student is preoccupied by trauma in their life, knowing how to respond to these students is vital to success as well. This is where Friday's collaboration has become a positive time where we can work on strategies that effectively foster how to respond and react in these situations.

Sometimes students are preoccupied with cell phones and other social media or activity that not only pulls their attention from instruction or learning activities, but also often causes a disruption in the classroom. Parents can help with this situation by not texting or messaging their students during the school day. Please encourage children to focus on their engagement. Parents can also help by stressing the importance of school attendance and arrival to school and class on time. Attendance behaviors that relate to the world of work need to be mastered by our young people so that they will be successful in life once they leave the walls of our high school....

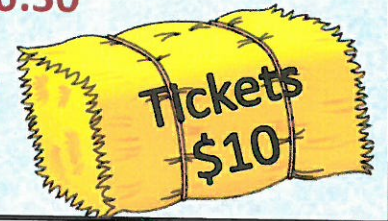
