Students from all four elementary schools took the stage, demonstrating developing skill, confidence, and pride in their performance.



Snowflake Art!




3rd graders in Mrs. Friedman's class combined symmetry, color, & creativity to design striking snowflake patterns under the guidance of art teacher Alicia Sather.



Butterfield's Winter Olympic Games!



Applying Technology in 7th Grade!




