

State law requires parents be notified of their right to opt-out their child from state testing, even though NES, the Neah-Kah-Nie School District and the Oregon Department of Education recommends that all students test. 



I will continue to provide weekly social skills to each class-room as well as providing support for students individually and in small groups.

We have been working on Kelso's Choices since the beginning of school. Ask your child the difference between a small problem and a big problem. Attached is Kelso's Wheel. It is a good tool at home as well. We will be introducing the Toolbox this year. The tools we are learning about help build resiliency, self-mastery and empathy in children. I encourage you to read the 12 tools and talk with your students about it.

If you have any questions or any concerns about your child feel free to contact me.

As the school counselor, one of the services I offer is small group counseling for students. Parent permission is required for students to participate. If you would like your child to participate in any of the groups below please cirlce which group interests you and fill out the information below. Once groups begin, I will send information home about each specific group. *If there is enough interest and time allows, there is the potential to offer multiple groups for students this year.
