Brownwood Lions Football Program 2025–2026 Season Review

The 2025 football season represented a year of meaningful growth for the Brownwood Lions Football Program. While our record alone does not fully capture the story of the season, the development of our student athletes, the improvement in our team performance, and the culture established throughout the year provide a strong foundation for continued success. One of the defining characteristics of this team was its resilience. The Lions faced early challenges against a demanding schedule but responded by embracing the coaching staff's expectations for discipline, accountability, and continuous improvement. Rather than allowing adversity to define the season, our players consistently demonstrated the willingness to learn, adapt, and compete at a higher level each week. The most encouraging aspect of the season was the noticeable improvement as the year progressed. Execution became sharper, communication improved, and the team's confidence steadily increased. Areas that presented challenges early in the season - including assignment discipline, limiting mistakes, and consistency on both sides of the ball - showed significant progress by district play. Practices became increasingly competitive, leadership within the locker room emerged naturally, and the team's preparation translated into improved performances on Friday nights. The improved performance resulted in the Varsity team ending the season as BiDistrict Champions, the JV team ending three yards short of a district championship, and the freshman team also ending the year with a second-place finish in the district. Beyond wins and losses, the program remained committed to developing young men of integrity. Student-athletes were challenged to demonstrate accountability in the classroom, leadership among their peers, and sportsmanship in competition. These values continue to serve as the cornerstone of the Brownwood football program and will have a lasting impact beyond athletics. The support shown by our school board, administration, faculty, parents, alumni, and community remained an essential part of the program's success. Brownwood has a proud football tradition, and our student athletes take great pride in representing that legacy every time they wear the maroon and white.

Brownwood Tennis End of Year Report 2025-26

Brownwood High School Tennis had 21 Varsity student-athletes (12 boys, 9 girls) and 22 Junior Varsity student-athletes (12 boys, 10 girls). In Team Tennis, Brownwood finished 3rd in District and advanced to the playoffs. We lost to Brock in the Bi-District round 10-1. Blake Hutchins was undefeated at #1 Singles in District, and Ashlyn Bundick and Blake Hutchins were undefeated in District and Bi-District in Mixed Doubles. In the spring, Brownwood Varsity Tennis had at least one player/team place in every tournament we played in. We won the Overall Team Award at the Glen Rose Invitational. Ashlyn Bundick and Blake Hutchins also went on an incredible 26-0 run in Mixed Doubles. They placed 2nd at District and advanced to the Regional Tennis Tournament. Also at the district tournament, Trine Baugh and Aiden Oplotnik placed 3rd in Boys Doubles, and Lanie Johnson and Eric Smith placed 3rd in Mixed Doubles.

Brownwood Middle School Tennis program had 53 student-athletes, which was an increase from the past few years. The 7th Grade Boys Team had 10, 7th Grade Girls had 23, 8th Grade Boys had 7 and 8th Grade Girls had 13. We also received a grant from the United States Tennis Association of \$25,000 to resurface the middle school tennis courts.

Volleyball

The Brownwood Lady Lions Volleyball Team finished the 2025 season with a 16-19 overall record and earned the program's first district victories since 2021. In our first year together, this team worked to establish a foundation of accountability, toughness, and putting the team first. tremendous growth was seen throughout the 2025 volleyball season.

The Lady Lions were recognized with five All-District selections: **First Team All-District** – Aniah Hines; **Second Team All-District** – Hannah Deen and Icess Hall; **Honorable Mention All-District** – Maddi Scott and Lanie Johnson. Academic All-District honors were earned by Aniah Hines, Hannah Deen, Icess Hall, Maddi Scott, Lanie Johnson, Kaydence Chandler, Grace Sparks, Jentry Coalson, Sara Stubblefield, Bellah Stokes, and Addy Huerta.

As we head into 2026, I truly believe we're just getting started. This program has a better understanding of what it takes to be successful, and I know this group has what it takes. The expectations have grown because our players have earned them. I'm excited to see how far this team can go, and I believe we're capable of taking the next step toward competing for a playoff spot and continuing to build a program our community can be proud of.

Softball

Brownwood Lady Lion Softball 2026 End Of Year Report Varsity - The Brownwood Lady Lion Softball program finished off the year 14-16 and 2-8 in district. Though the team did not reach their goal of playoffs this season, there were some measurable highlights. The Lady Lions went into extra innings four times in district play and battled the District Champions, Brock (#10 in state 4A), in extra innings both of their contests.

They started preseason on a hot streak, winning all of their games at the Killeen 5/6A Tournament. After graduating 5 starting seniors the year prior, this is a great foundation for the future of the program. JV - Our Junior Varsity had 14 players and finished their season with 8 wins. At the JV level, pitching became a huge highlight this season. Players were able to execute higher level defensive plays and expand their knowledge of the game.

In the batter's box, we saw a drastic difference in quality at bats from the start of season to the end. We utilized one-on-one hitting workouts, and that seemed to develop intentional batting habits that will continue to build our JV.
