News from the Assistant Principal:


SBAC and MSAA testing has been completed for the 3rd grade students. This process was planned out well and staff worked diligently in getting all our students tested in a timely manner. WIDA screening will begin May 8, 2019 for all 3rd graders who are Tier 3. MBI Bronze status paperwork was submitted for MBI and we have received norification that BES has made Bronze status. BES will be sending a team to Bozeman this summer. The team will also send a representative to showcase BES cultural day and focus at the school for the Best Practices EXPO during the MBI summer sessions.

Final Cultural Day & Naming Ceremony:

Our final cultural day & naming ceremony will be May 10, 2019. We have many exciting projects and lessons ready for BES and Babb school. It is so rewarding for us to provide this opportunity to students and families in our community.

ELA

Our final benchmark testing will happen May 9, 2019. We are gearing up to make the best of showing off our skills on the ISIP test and meeting our 15% increase and decrease goals.



- 3rd Grade decreased 20% from September 2018 to April 2019

- Teachers finished up PDSA #5 in April and analyzed their instruction and student data to determine who needs further instruction for the next PDSA and who will move onto regular classroom instruction.
- 2nd Grade Teachers looked at the instruction for tier 3 students from the book How do I plan and teach reading groups and paired to study and present out to their peers for Vocabulary, Text Type, Phonics, and Writing.
- Both 2nd and 3rd grade teachers analyzed the ISIP Summary Report to determine who is close to moving tiers:
 - o Tier 3 to tier 2
 - o Tier 2 to tier 1
- They further determined who is in danger of falling back:
 - o Tier 1 to tier 2
 - o Tier 2 to tier 3
- The Grade Levels planned out Authentic literacy instruction for the last 3 weeks of school
- o All 3rd grade students took the SBAC assessment over four days in April
- o Misti Woltz returned and walkthroughs focused on small group ELA

Instructional Rounds

BES staff had the opportunity to visit other classrooms to improve their teaching craft. The problem of practice they looked at were 1) Teacher Clarity-Focus Walls, 2) CRA (Concrete-Representational-Abstract), and 3) Discussion Between Students. Great discussions were had in our debriefing sessions, and deep reflections on next steps were shared.

Napi staff was invited over to observe our Math block stations. Collaborating with Napi Administration and Staff was new and fun-we hope to be able to do more in the future.

Instructional rounds take about 1 ½ hours to run, requires at least 6 subs and we do four sections on two days. This process takes focused objectives with a detailed schedule. All the time taken to plan and prep for this experience is so worth it to see the teachers learning new ways to teach and provide learning for their students. This was a strategy learned and reinforced during our MSRP and MCLP granting years.

Innovative Award

With the MCLP grant, our school was able to apply for an Innovative Grant based on what BES has in place for closing the achievement gap. We are pleased to announce that BES has been awarded at least \$10,000 for the Innovative Grant!! We will be meeting with OPI staff next week to plan for how we want to spend the grant in the areas of either ELA, MATH or CULTURE/CLIMATE. We are very proud of our hard work and dedication to carrying out the MCLP initiatives.

YEAR END WRAP UP

As the year wraps up, staff is preparing for planning and purchasing for next year to make the 2019-2020 school year more effective and efficient. Professional Development has been on new strategies and time for reflection for new supplies or organizational supplies needed.
