**Subject:** Policy GKG SEISD Volunteer Policy

**Date:** August 13, 2025

HISTORY: Policy GKG addresses the district's expectations and guidelines for school volunteers. It establishes the foundation for volunteer participation in district activities, including provisions related to background checks, training, supervision, and scope of service. The policy has been reviewed considering updated legal guidance from the Texas Association of School Boards (TASB) Policy Service and recent legislative changes. Proposed 2025–2026 school year updates reflect current legal requirements, best practices in school safety, and alignment with the district's volunteer handbook.

**RATIONALE:** The GKG policy ensures that all volunteers who interact with students and staff do so in a safe, consistent, and regulated manner. With increased community involvement and a growing number of volunteers supporting district programs, a clear, board-approved policy is essential for ensuring accountability, legal compliance, and the protection of all stakeholders. Updated language supports uniform application of screening procedures, expectations for conduct, and district oversight.

**BUDGET IMPACT:** There is no significant budget impact. Volunteer screening costs, including background checks, are already incorporated into the district's annual operating budget for human resources and safety protocols.

**ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION:** The administration recommends that the Board of Trustees approve the revised Policy GKG (Community Relations: School Volunteers) for implementation in the 2025–2026 school year.
