It is wonderful to see the hallways and classrooms full of children and staff again! We have hit the ground running, practicing our procedures and expectations for PBIS on Thursday and Friday of last week. While much of what we do has stayed the same, we do have some changes from last year:

- We are no longer able to provide the level of music that we have in the past, however, plans are being discussed to integrate music into other parts of our day.
- Lunch periods have been extended and students now go to recess prior to eating lunch.

• We have two new teachers to the building. Mrs. Kelly Higgins and Ms. Stefanie Davis teach third grade. • As with most of the districts in Vermilion County, we have discontinued our CARE program until state funding is restored. Mrs. Thornton and Mrs. Penny Higgins, two of our preschool teachers last year, now teach second grade.

• There have been some changes in several of our bus routes and the transition appears to be coming right along.

Later this fall, we hope to have the Information Now program ready to go. This program will allow you to have online access to student information such as grades and attendance.

It has been a few busy weeks in our Kindergarten world. We have been enjoying getting to know one another and learning all our new friends names. The PBIS committee makes school-wide plans to create a positive school climate. Here are a few aspects of PBIS and where you can help!

- A big THANK YOU to Susan, Kathern and Kara for attending our first Green Team meeting. If you would like to become part of our PBIS Green team, call or send a note to school with your student.
- Our classes are divided into "FAMILIES" where a Kindergarten, First, Second and Third grade room will, at times, do activities/ celebrations together. Ask your child if he or she is a Skittle, Smartie, Starburst or a Sweet Tart!
- 2QT—What is that? In order to help fund our celebrations and other fun activities, each month there will be a "Two Quarter Tuesday!". By bringing 2 quarters, students will be able to participate in a low-key activity. September 14th will be "Hat Day". Any student who wishes to wear a hat that day can bring in \$. 50.
