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## **School Improvement Data**

In recent months, the departments of School Improvement, Advanced Academics and Assessment have worked in concert to gather district, state and national data. Data points from the department of labor on future job growth trends, college degree trends, educational attainment's impact on salary projections, state and CISD high school graduation rates, state and CISD career and college readiness rates, state and CISD success initiative rates, campus demographic data, campus at-risk data, student participation rates in various high school academic programs by middle school, middle school college readiness rates and college graduation rates. These data points have been reviewed by district and campus administrators. Our next step with administrators is to engage all in a dialogue about what constitutes student success at each campus level. For example, what constitutes success for a 5<sup>th</sup> grader, 8<sup>th</sup> grader, 12<sup>th</sup> grader and college freshman.

Due to the expansiveness of this data, three aspects of the comprehensive data will be presented at the board meeting. It will include the following topic areas:

- 1. Campus Demographic Information
- 2. Student High School Participation Rates in Academic Programs by Middle Schools
- 3. College Graduate Rates

After reviewing this portion of the data, we would suggest subsequent conversations on other data points and the questions that these data points generate.
