The program is offered by United States Department of Agriculture through Texas Department of Agriculture. This program would allow Child Nutrition to provide free breakfast and lunch options to all students enrolled at the ten schools regardless of family

financial position. These ten school sites will no longer be responsible for unpaid meal debt and the ongoing collection throughout the school year. There is potential for households' savings with the implementation of this program.
