LINK Programming

Opportunities created by Community Education staff, along with LINK participants, are designed to enrich the lives of adults with disabilities as active and engaged members of the community. Dinner at local restaurants, roller skating, swimming, fishing, recreational sports and themed parties are just a few of the activities that LINK offers each year.

LINK offered 38 activities with an average of 13 participants attending each during 2009-2010 fiscal year.
