ECRA Longitudinal Performance Study



ECRA looked back at our junior student performance from 2022 to 2025 using the new 2025 state standards. By applying these new standards to past years, we can see how districts would have measured up over time. They also made ACT and SAT scores comparable, so we can look at those trends over the same four-year period. Finally, they included an Illinois percentile rank, based on 2024 results, to help understand how students' proficiency compares to others in the state.


ECRA looked at three things:

- Met: The percentage of students who met or exceeded the new 2025 proficiency standards.
- **Percentile**: This is the percentage of all students across Illinois that the average district student performs equal to or better than (based on 2024 norms).
- Count: The total number of students included in the analysis.








Advanced Placement at LHS

The College Board keeps record of a student's career AP exam performance, and awards those who excel as described below:

- <u>AP Scholar</u> Students who complete 3 or more exams with scores of 3 or higher
- <u>AP Scholar with Honor</u> Average score of at least 3.25 on all exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on 4 or more exams
- <u>AP Scholar with Distinction</u> Average of at least 3.5 on all exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on 5 or more exams

- \$1,177 for students at four-year public, out-of-state colleges
- \$1,642 for students at four-year private, nonprofit colleges
