# 2025/2026 Class Assignment & Configurations

To keep class sizes optimal for learning, the Neah-Kah-Nie School District is adding one teacher at Garibaldi Grade School (GGS) and one teacher at Nehalem Elementary School (NES) for the upcoming school year. The school board is deeply committed to keeping elementary class sizes small, and this additional staffing will help us achieve that goal.

## Understanding Our Blended Classrooms

In a smaller school community, our grade-level configurations are directly driven by enrollment numbers. Both elementary schools in our district utilize blended grade classrooms (such as K/1, 2/3, 3/4, or 4/5) to evenly distribute students. This ensures balanced class sizes across the entire school.

Our goal is to avoid situations where one class has only 12 students while another has 25. Balancing these numbers creates the best possible environment for both students and teachers.

**How We Handle Math:** Teaching math in a blended classroom can be complex due to distinct grade-level standards. To address this, we use a "Walk to Math" format. This structure ensures that only one grade level is present in each math class. Additionally, we staff larger math groups with instructional assistants to provide robust, targeted support.

## Anticipated Grade-Level Configurations

Summer enrollment—including new families moving to the area, new housing developments, and opening apartments—frequently impacts our final numbers. While things may shift over the summer, here is our current plan for the upcoming school year's classroom configurations:

## **Class Placement Timeline**

Classroom placements will be made available to families via **ParentVue** in late August. We typically finalize and release this information the Friday before school starts to ensure all end-of-summer enrollees are accounted for and properly placed.

When building classrooms, our staff spends a significant amount of time carefully weighing multiple factors. We work diligently to balance each room in terms of:

- Total number of students
- Gender balance
- Academic needs
- Behavioral dynamics
- Gender

Because of the complexity of this balancing act, **our school does not accept parent requests for specific teachers or grade-level configurations.** Please know that we deeply value what is best for your children, and we dedicate a tremendous amount of care and consideration to t

## NES Attendance Update- How Are We Doing With Our Attendance Rate? By Kristi Mills, Principal

Attendance is a key part of student success, and we want to take a moment to celebrate the incredible progress we've seen in our student attendance this school year!

Thank you to all our parents and guardians for your dedication to getting your children to school on time and ready to learn. Whether it's adjusting morning routines or overcoming unexpected hurdles, your hard work is making a real difference. Look how NES's attendance monthly data has improved compared to last year's data:

# Summer EBT Program

Dear Families,

We're excited to share that the **Oregon Summer EBT program is back for summer 2026!** This program helps families buy food during the summer. Each eligible student can get **\$120 for groceries.**

## Who can get this benefit?

Your school-age child may be automatically eligible if:

- Your family gets SNAP, TANF, or Oregon Health Plan (Medicaid) and meets income rules.
- Your child gets free or reduced-price school meals and meets income rules.
- Your child is in foster care, in migrant education, experiencing homelessness, in a qualified Head Start, or part of the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR).

Your school-age child may be eligible by application if:

- Your family meets the federal income requirements for free or reduced-price meals at school, and
- Your child attends a school that participates in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) or School Breakfast Program (SBP).

## Important things to know:

- If you got Summer EBT last year through an approved application (2025), you don't need to apply again. Your family will get benefits on **June 4, 2026.**
- If you're new to the program and didn't get benefits automatically on June 4, you must apply by **Sept. 1, 2026.**
- The money will be placed on an **Oregon EBT card** and can be used at most grocery stores, farmers markets, and more.
