

Summer 2022 ARP Programming

1. Ranger Outdoor Adventure \$20,500
Life skills, survival skills, team building & leadership skills (see detailed descriptions.)
2. Learning Through Baseball \$5,000
Day 1: Field trip to Target Field for Environment & Sustainability of Target Field Educational Tour: Learn how LEED credits are earned at Target Field, and how the ballpark meets the many environmental challenges of a sports facility. In conjunction with SALT & Environmental Science classes. (These educational tours are not offered on the same day as home games.)
Day 2: Next available home game - return to Target Field with the same group to watch the Twins play and see the game from a new perspective with the information learned during the previous trip. Would obtain group seating and include food & beverages.
3. Camp Invention Subsidies & Scholarships \$5,000
 - Offset cost of Camp Invention registration for all students by \$75. (Reduced registration cost is \$150/student)
 - Provide additional scholarships for students with financial need of \$100/student. (Reduces registration to \$50.)
4. Youth Center Partnership \$2,500
Expand hours and offerings at the Cuyuna Range Youth Center for Summer of 2022 to include an additional 2 afternoons per week for ages 13 - 17 with a meal provided. Would help cover staffing & cost of food/beverages.
5. Community Ed Mentorship Picnics \$1,500
Weekly picnics in the City Park with Community Ed Staff to provide a meal and mentorship opportunities for community youth. Abby and Lynk would bring food (Raffertys, Subway, Mixed Company, other boxed lunches) and set up yard games at the park for 2 - 3 hours on a designated day each week throughout the summer.

Total Estimated Costs: \$34,500

ESSER Allocation: \$34,746 with all funds needing to be expended by August 31, 2022
