Eagle Pass High School Student Council Earns Statewide Recognition

For outstanding achievement in leadership, service, and activities that improve the school and community, Eagle Pass High School Student Council has been named as a Sweepstakes Council. Sweepstakes councils must be recognized as an Outstanding Student Council and receive awards in the categories of Drugs, Alcohol, Safety and Health (DASH); Pride and Patriotism; and Energy and Environment as well as submitting a Community Service Report.

The Texas Association of Student Councils (TASC) has 1269 member schools. Of those, Eagle Pass High School is one of only 230 student councils statewide to receive this highly-esteemed honor.

Student Council members develop proven skills in team building, problem solving, project planning, and decision making. Through their co-curricular activities, student council members serve their communities while strengthening their academic and civic skills.

Jacqueline Gonzalez, president of EPHS Student Council expressed her excitement in earning this recognition saying, "We are honored to be named Outstanding Student Council and to receive Sweepstakes recognition which means we excelled in all areas. We would have not accomplished this without the hard work and time our Student Council members invested every day to create a change."

EPHS Student Council strives to help the campus and the community year-round. For the 2018-2019 school year EPHS StuCo logged 10,997 community service hours; they donated \$52,266.60 to the school and community, \$38,000 of which were in blood donations; and \$3,500 in cash donations.

The TASC outstanding school recognition program is designed to set a standard of excellence for Texas student councils as outlined in criteria published in state report forms. The report forms are reviewed annually by the TASC Board of Directors to ensure that the recognition program is rigorous and relevant. Fewer than 20% of TASC member schools are recognized in one or more areas, so this is quite an accomplishment of which Eagle Pass High School is very proud.

TASC is a non-profit serving high school and middle level student councils in Texas. Sponsored by the Texas Association of Secondary School Principals, its purposes are to develop leadership abilities in students, promote democracy as a way of life, and uphold high standards for local councils. With over 1200 member schools, it is the largest state student leadership organization in the US.

Awards are mailed to schools from the state office in April.

How to use this reporting tool: District presidents should list in ALPHABETICAL ORDER all schools to be recognized with any award on this spreadsheet. For schools receiving recognition in any of these categories (OSC, DASH, E&E, P&P), please note the number of points received in the appropriate column. Minimum points required are noted below. (Do not record points that fall below the minimum point requirement.) Schools submitting a Community Service report form should be designated with an 'x' in the appropriate column (no point value required). Schools recognized for OSC, DASH, E&E, P&P and Community Service qualify for sweepstakes designation. If so, place an 'x' in the Sweepstakes column.

How to submit this report tool to the state office: District presidents should submit this information via email to beverly@tassp.org no later than March 23, 2019. To protect the integrity of the program, the email must be sent from the current district president school of record. Additionally, TASC staff will only make changes to the formal district reporting tool at the written direction of the current district president. It is vital to the success of the program that information submitted is accurate and complete.
