

RESOLUTION #2018-19-20

Recommended Increases – District Meal Prices for 2019/20

Discussion:

A proposed increase in District Meal Prices for the **2019-2020** School year is due to the Federal “Healthy Hunger-Free Kids Act” which reauthorized the National School Lunch Program. This regulation requires the District to increase meal prices to meet Federal Equity Pricing Requirements. Complying with the equity in pricing will necessitate raising all school lunch prices by \$0.10.

Elementary	\$1.00	No Change
Junior/Senior High School	\$1.25	No Change
Reduced Price Breakfast	\$0.00	No Change*
Adult Breakfast	\$2.40	\$2.50

**Notes: Reduced prices are set by the Federal Government. The State is currently paying the reduced breakfast and reduced lunch price, so for the 2019-2020 School year this will remain the same and the district will not need to charge students who are approved for reduced meals.*

Breakfast costs have not increased since before the 2012-13 school year.

Resolution #2018-19-20 APPROVE RECOMMENDED INCREASE IN DISTRICT MEAL PRICES FOR THE 2019-20 SCHOOL YEAR.

WHEREAS, the Federal “Healthy Hunger-Free Food Act” requires the district to increase meal prices to meet Federal equity pricing requirements; and WHEREAS, the fixed price for Pattern Meals and Meal Price Equivalents is increasing to offset the continuing increases in the cost of food; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors approves the recommended increase in meal prices for the 2019-20 school year.
