LEARNING HIGHLIGHTS AND COMMUNICATIONS UPDATE

Mark Snyder shared learning highlights from various programs and activities throughout the district.

PRESENTATIONS

Orion Oaks Elementary School Showcase: Teacher, Janet Ursitti, and fifth grade students, highlighted leadership activities including food drives, recycling, positivity project, ROCK and ROLL clubs, and others.

Post-Construction Storm Water Plan: Operations Director, Wes Goodman, presented the storm water plan as required by the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System. The District is required to follow Oakland County stormwater design standards; establish and maintain stormwater policies; provide notice and instruction to district staff; inform the public of storm water goals and policy (public education); ensure maintenance schedules are followed; and obtain requisite Part 91 Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Permits as necessary for any construction that may impact waterways.

STRATEGIC AREA DISCUSSION ITEMS

Governance

<u>Superintendent's Update:</u> Ben Kirby reported that January is School Board Appreciation month. The District will formally recognize Board members at the January 25 meeting. Board members received a small gift of appreciation from Frank Rewold & Sons. He reported he will be attending the MASA conference next week. He also discussed the following:

- Legislative Update: New members of Michigan legislature assumed office on January 1. The State of The State Address is scheduled for January 25. Two proposed bills requiring MDE to create resources for deaf and hard of hearing students and requiring districts to create critical incident mapping were signed into law by the Governor. The Let Michigan Kids Learn Initiative has been withdrawn. Federal government has leadership positions in place and will continue their work.
- Policy Committee Report: Susan Flaherty reported the committee met on December 21 to review the update with Wayne Wright from NEOLA.
 - First Reading NEOLA Update 37-1: Policies 0144.1, 6108, 6460, 6700, 7440.03: Policy recommendations were reviewed. The Board is not currently interested in re-instating compensation, so does not want to adopt the new Board compensation policy. No other changes were recommended. Second reading and approval is scheduled for January 25.

Student Achievement

<u>Assistant Superintendent Update:</u> Heidi Mercer shared that the district was awarded a \$90k grant from MDE for elementary intervention. She discussed the Martin Luther King Jr. Day activities scheduled for January 16 as well as a Parent University session for February 16. Middle of the year testing data will be presented to the Board in February. Cell Out for Soldiers is this Friday at the High School.

<u>Bond Design Teams Report:</u> Blanche Sims will host an open house on May 21 before the current building is removed. Scripps offices should be complete by the end of January. Upcoming summer work is scheduled for Blanche Sims, secure entries at Waldon, Oakview and Pine Tree, as well as many technology projects.

Human Resources

Assistant Superintendent Update: Rick Arnett discussed the following:

- Certified New Hire Recommendations: The Board reviewed three staff recommendation.
- Schools of Choice for 2023-24: The Board reviewed current SOC enrollment by building and grade level. Discussion was held to assist in determining the language for approval at the next meeting that best captures the goals of having a variable target of 10% of total district and building enrollment, offering slots in grades K-8 as well as Learning Options, and only where space is available.
