In November I was able to finish creating EL files for kindergarten and other new students, and get those files placed in the cum folders. We have also started preparations for ELPA, which opens in January. Other than that, things are humming along.

I look forward to discussing with the admin team options for live translation in classrooms (for newcomers). The technology has been around for a short while, and we have used it in some classrooms, with student tablets pulling teacher talk out of the air and interpreting it live. The main drawback has been background noise interfering with what the teacher is saying. We now have the possibility of pairing this same technology with Audio Enhancement teacher microphones. So, this is something that we are hoping to explore.

This year we are looking at, and developing, some innovative practice strategies for OBOB. For example, we are planning to use the Kahoot! platform to test students of their knowledge of the books and give them opportunities to practice answering questions before the matches begin.
