Projected Growth/Growth Rate: Occupational projections are created by Idaho Labor analysts by first projecting the total employment levels of Idaho's industries in 10 years.

With industry employment projected, analysts then use staffing patterns to calculate the mix of occupations that will be required to staff Idaho's industries at their projected future employment levels.

Annual Exits: Exit rates are calculated by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and represent the expected number of openings in an occupation created by workers leaving the labor force altogether.

People exit the labor force for a variety of reasons including retirement, becoming a stay-at-home parent, caretaker for a relative or to return to school. Annual exits estimates the openings that will be created to replace these exiting workers.

Annual Transfers: Transfer rates are calculated by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and represented the expected number of openings in an occupation created when workers leave their occupation to find employment in a different occupation.

Annual Change: Estimated by the Idaho Department of Labor, Annual Change represents the number of openings in an occupation that result from a new job being created.

These openings are the product of economic growth, not the replacement of departing workings (captured in exits and transfers).

Total Annual Openings: The total job openings created annually in a given occupation from all sources. This number is the sum of Annual Exits, Annual Transfers and Annual Change.
