Re: Approving the Disposal of Out of Adoption Instructional Materials

According to Chapter 66 of the Texas Administrative Code (TAC) for State Adoption and Distribution of Instructional Materials, Subchapter DD (Commissioner's Rules Concerning Instructional Materials Allotment), Subsection 66.1317 designates that the Board of Trustees of a school district must notify the Texas Education Agency of its intent to sell or dispose of instructional materials.

Attached are the Instructions for the Sale or Disposal of Instructional Materials which is required to be completed and signed for by the Board of Trustees. After Board signatures are completed, these forms will be submitted to the Texas Education Agency (TEA) for final approval and permission to sell or donate the Out of Adoption instructional materials listed.

Once approval has been granted, approximately 8 pallets of Out of Adoption instructional materials will be picked up free of charge by Franklin Media Textbook Solutions and recycled. Currently, there aren't any non-profit organizations in the State of Texas who are picking up textbooks for donation or redistribution. Franklin Media provided the best option, and at no cost to the District.

Note: Should any compensation be received by the District from the sale of instructional materials, it would be returned to Coppell ISD's designated account for textbooks and would be used towards the purchase of new instructional materials and/or technological equipment and/or software allowed under Texas Education Code Section 31.0211.

Recommendation: That the Coppell ISD Board of Trustees approve as presented, the donation of the District's Out of Adoption Instructional Materials to Franklin Media Textbook Solutions. Upon Board approval, CISD will then submit the approved recommendation to the Texas Education Agency (TEA) for their required approval.

Instructional Materials or Technological Equipment Sale or Disposal Notification Form

General Information

Prior to the sale or disposal of instructional materials, the district or open-enrollment charter school must notify Texas Education Agency (TEA) of its intent to sell or dispose of instructional materials or technological equipment. Upon notification, TEA will enter inventory adjustments into EMAT for each transaction of instructional materials that are sold, disposed of, or acquired through the sale of instructional materials.

The local board or governing body president and secretary must sign the completed Instructional Materials or Technological Equipment Sale or Disposal Notification Form(s). Submit all sale or disposal forms via email to instructional.materials@tea.texas.gov as an attachment.

Districts and open-enrollment charter schools must consider the following before selling or disposing of instructional materials:

- Instructional materials used by the district should collectively cover all elements of the essential knowledge and skills of the required curriculum, other than physical education, for each subject and grade level.
- Worn-out materials may be sold for recycling when the district declares them unsuitable for student use. Alternatively, worn-out materials may be sold to a reseller that will re-bind the materials and make them suitable for classroom use.
- The local board of trustees or governing body must reasonably expect that these materials will not be needed for several
 years. Some elective subject materials may qualify as materials the district will not need for several years if the electives
 will not be offered.
- Any funds received by the district or school from the sale of instructional materials must be used to purchase instructional materials or technological equipment allowed under Texas Education Code §31.0211.
