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- 5 Policy Name: Student Enrollment, Exceptional Circumstances Meriting Waiver of Age Requirements for Pupils
  - Regulation: -----

9 Prohibition: This policy cannot be used to provide what is otherwise characterized or referred to as a 10 pre-school, pursuant to20-7-117(2), MCA, which specifically prohibits the use of state equalization aid 11 for preschool. This policy is intended for use to enroll students under the age of 5 when statutory 12 criteria are met.

14 Student Enrollment, Exceptional Circumstances Meriting Waiver of Age Requirements for Pupils Note: 15 In order to adopt this policy, the board of trustees must select one or more of the characteristics 16 identified in either Option A or Option B.

18 The administration shall ensure admission, enrollment and assignment of all qualifying children 19 referenced in this policy. The administration shall place children enrolled pursuant to this policy in 20 either a half-time or full-time kindergarten program as an integral part of the elementary school 21 program. The administration shall also ensure provision of a free appropriate public education in the 22 least restrictive environment possible, pursuant to terms of each student's individualized education 23 program, for all children enrolled under this policy who are qualified for services under the Individuals 24 with Disabilities Education Act. 25

26 The administration shall include children enrolled pursuant to this policy in the district's calculation of 27 average number belonging (ANB) as reported to OPI. 28

29 Option B, Exceptional Circumstances Present in the Community: To be used only for in-district students 30 or homeless students under the McKinney Homeless Assistance Act when the board of trustees wants to 31 define exceptional circumstances applicable to the community's characteristics, as opposed to the 32 individual characteristics of a particular student or sub-group of students. 33

34 The Board of Trustees declares the following to be qualifying "exceptional circumstances" within the 35 meaning of that term as used in 20-5-101(3), that merit waiving the age provisions of 20-5-101(1), MCA 36 for children under 6 years of age who are either 4 years of age or older on or before September 10 of the 37 school year in which enrollment is to occur or who are at least 3 years of age with a disability qualifying 38 the child for services under Section 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973 or the federal 39 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

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41 Note: Each of the below should be considered separately for inclusion or exclusion in the Board's 42 adopted policy. When enrolling on the basis of demographic characteristics of the community under this 43 Option B, the District must be sure to research and document all of the criteria incorporated into the 44 school district's policy that is used to enroll on the basis of exceptional circumstances.
