Fall MAP Testing:

- 100% of our students tested.
- 7 out of 36 students improved their reading scores 36%.
- 16 out of 36 students improved their math scores 44%.
- 10 out of 36 students improved their language arts scores -28%.
- Our students will be spending 40 to 50 minutes a week on Math and/or Reading intervention in the MyPath Edgenuity intervention program in order to help them improve their math and reading skills.
