Data Reflection:

Using our Fall and Winter Benchmark scores we see a lot of our BHS students fall in the Tier 2 category. Our walk-through data shows our lesson cycle is most solid in the I do and You do areas (beginning and ending). The middle of our lessons-guided practice and reflective learning needs to be form. By addressing the collaborative dialogue between students and students as well as staff to students we expect to see our spring benchmark scores move. Staff are working on strategies to incorporate more opportunities for students to discuss their learning.

BHS recently lost a student in February. District and community support has been here on campus assisting us with coping with the loss. BPS counselors, Spookinapii, and Blackfeet Behavioral Health. BHS provided the staff with self-care activities on their extended professional development day. Professionals came in and led activities for exercise, nourishment, meditation, journaling, card making, guided imagery, art therapy, and medicine pouches. Each staff was encouraged to attend the activities with a colleague as to not be alone.

Closed Campus

For the last month we have closed campus due to the large amount of tardies after lunch. We offered more food options, and more seating in the breezeway. We have seen the tardy numbers slowly decrease-yet still large. There are also large amounts of tardies and absences during the other class periods. We will be implementing a plan for detention & other consequences and one for incentives. This will be mailed to parents, students and staff.
