## **Dear Parents of English PreAP/AP Students and Drama Students:**

Thirteen years ago, one of our dreams as teachers came true: Taking students to Utah's Shakespeare Festival in Cedar City and then to hike and write in Zion National Park. This summer, we have put together our thirteenth annual trip. We will see four Shakespeare plays, (Comedy of Errors, Henry IV, Measure for Measure, and Twelfth Night). Also on our agenda: the musical Into the Woods, and Jane Austen's Sense and Sensibility, adapted for the stage.

The festival is hosted by Southern Utah University (SUU) and won a Tony Award in 2000 for Outstanding Regional Theatre. The trip is designed to give PreAP and AP English students and drama students additional exposure to Shakespeare, the theatre, and creative writing. Because the trip is meant for enrichment to our regular curricula and because the workload in PreAP and AP English is already heavy, the preparation for this special field trip is not arduous. Our intent is to add more pleasure and depth to our English and drama courses. The trip will include opportunities to see many facets of working theatres such as how sets are changed in repertory, as well as give students the chance to hear actors and directors talk about their craft at the actors' seminars held under the fir trees. Several of the events students like best are the Stage Combat and Shakespearean Text classes taught by actors performing in the Festival.

We have obtained discounts where we could, but the cost of the trip may still be beyond what your family can afford. PLEASE, IF YOUR STUDENT WANTS TO COME BUT COST PROHIBITS IT, LOOK FOR INFO ON CAR WASHES ON MR. BALL'S ATORT WEBSITE. SEVERAL CAR WASHES ARE PLANNED FOR JULY and AUGUST. We also may have some scholarship money available. Remember, your fees can count as an Arizona Tax Credit. Be sure to ask Nina in the bookstore to deposit your trip fees in the Utah Trip Acct, #548. If you forget to ask, she'll put it in a different account that will not allow you the credit. (State law allows married couples to deposit more than this trip costs, so if you'd like your whole \$400. credit allowance to go to Drama or the Utah Shakespeare acct. for further use in these programs or to finance another student's trip, feel free; we always have students who need financial help. (An unmarried person is allowed a \$200. tax credit.)

Time is very short; deadlines are approaching rapidly. All money must be turned into the bookstore by Tuesday, AUG. 19. **7:10 p.m. Greenshow,** a free musical variety show on the green (the lawn) at SUU. Vendors sell tarts, and Elizabethan concession stand is open.

11 p.m. Actors' cabaret at The Grind Coffeehouse in downtown Cedar City. (Please bring a \$10 donation with you.)

Friday, 8/29 Eat breakfast from ice chests. We will go to the supermarket this morning as well.

**9 a.m. Literary Seminar** Go to Seminar Grove under the fir trees to hear audience discuss last night's plays. (The seminar is free.)

10-12 Classes in Shakespearean Text and Stage Combat

**Depart 8 a.m.** for 50-min. drive to **Zion National Park for Writers' Workshop.** Hike through the Virgin River's "Narrows" to a spot where we will read and write nature poetry. Easy hike up River Trail (1 mile) to beginning of "The Narrows," a gorgeous section of the Virgin River. All hiking up into The Narrows (2 miles) is in the water, sometimes hip-level. Time for writing and journaling in small groups as you hike. If the weatherboard at the Zion Ranger Station forecasts inclement weather, we will choose a different hike to avoid the possibility of a flash flood in The Narrows. Pack a lunch. Voluntary writing share in the evening.

WHAT TO BRING: DO NOT BRING RIPPED OR FRAYED CLOTHING, even if it has rips below the knee!

Clothing for the festival is informal but still must meet or exceed our MUHS dress code, e.g., tops must have sleeves, no tops or transparent fabric that exposes your midriff, no inappropriately revealing clothing. If in doubt about your clothing choices, lean toward more modest, conservative choices. Young men might bring a collared shirt for the evening plays, but ties are not necessary. Dresses are fine for young women during the evening, but it gets cold. Nice looking Capri pants or pants are just fine as well. No sexually suggestive slogans on T-shirts. You will be conspicuous and identifiable as a group. Every year we are announced and pointed out to the general public as being from Mingus Union H.S. Sometimes we are filmed or up on stage (the Green show). Wear modest clothing that doesn't show your underwear when you sit on the grass or crawl around in Stage Combat class.

**Light jacket or sweatshirt, umbrella, blanket**. The evening Shakespeare plays are outdoors. You will be *miserable* and cold at the evening plays if you have no sweater. It often rains during our stay! Cedar City is colder than the Verde Valley.

Food for ice chests and money for possibly one restaurant meal and money to purchase groceries when we get to Utah. All told, you will be eating 15 meals. We will be stopping at the supermarket twice in Cedar City. At all times you will have the option of a eating out of your ice chest or buying at a grocery store. Sometimes you may have the option of eating at a restaurant or a fast food place,

but you must pack breakfast and lunch for Thursday and lunch on Sunday at Zion. In order to get to Utah before the matinee, we will not stop to purchase a meal. Pack breakfast and lunch for Thursday!
