Summary of Data

- 5th year of AVID at the high school, graduating our second cohort this year
- 4th year of AVID at the middle school, accomplished National Demonstration Status. Currently only 3% of schools nationwide have reached this status.
- There are 5 elective classes at the high school serving 144 students, and 5 elective classes at the middle school serving 144 students


