3. **Professional Development January**

COSSA staff will meet on Monday, January 16 for professional development:

This will be primarily a workday with an emphasis on priority deliverables which include pre-posttests, syllabuses, and emergency sub plans. In our kickoff meeting, we will review those items along with areas of focus which include the beginning of Q3 and ongoing initiatives such as restorative practices, culture building, Danielson framework, and advisory circles.

Teachers have been scheduled for individual check-in meetings to review their Individualized Professional Learning Plans (IPLP) and implementation of advisory circles along with any other needs they may have.'

Student handbook committee meetings have been scheduled in order to review the existing handbook, and to make changes according to current initiatives such as restorative practices. This will require additional committee meeting times which will be scheduled in the coming PD days.

Senior Projects were delivered on December 21st and met with excellent feedback regarding the quality of the presentations and projects. Multiple seniors did live demonstrations in auto and diesel with other projects being delivered via electronic slide presentations in the large COSSA conference room. Q3 is now in full swing and with the addition of our new school counselor, Gabbi Nash, we look forward to a successful quarter. We have seen a decline in student discipline referrals and have seen improved relationship building skills in our teachers and amongst the students themselves. In one instance, there was a conflict that was mediated outside of the school, which, in the past, would have caused a disruption for the students involved. We believe that teaching students how better to communicate is improving their ability to resolve these more common types of misunderstandings.
