Superintendent's Report: The Districts received information from the Commissioner of MDE and Heather Mueller stated the CDC has been clear that the new masking guidance applies to people who are *fully vaccinated*. Our elementary students have not yet been vaccinated, eligibility just opened up 12- to 15-year-olds this week, and only some 16- to 18-year-olds are fully vaccinated. Knowing that our schools are places with a very high concentration of unvaccinated individuals, we must keep the requirement in place through the end of the school year. Northome plans to hold graduation in the gymnasium and masks will be required. However, there will NOT be a limit on the number of guests each graduate can invite.
