The plan must reflect strategies and activities to be implemented by the LEA during the remainder of the 2013-2014 school year. The LEA must use the 2013 Title III CIP template and instructions provided by TEA. Additional information regarding how to access the 2013 Title III CIP resources which will also include a CIP training PowerPoint and sample CIP will be forthcoming. The LEA must submit the CIP as a file upload using the same NCLB Reports application used to access the AMAOs results on the TEA Secure Environment (TEASE). The Title III CIP must be received by TEA no later than February 21, 2014.
