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2023-2024 School Improvement Plan Goals

Increase graduation rate by 2% in the 2023-2024 school year.

• The East High graduation rate grew to 90% from 88% in the 2022-2023 school year.

Increase 9th grade on-track rate by 2% in the 2023-2024 school year.

• The 9th grade on-track rate was 81% compared to 84% in the 2022-2023 school year.

Design and prepare block schedule for 90% of students and staff by June 30, 2024.

• East Aurora High School fully implemented block scheduling for all students and staff in the 2024-2025 school year.





2024-2025 Summary - Highlights

During the 2024-2025 school year:

- 34.05% of Advanced Placement (AP) students earned a score of 3 or higher on their AP exam in the Spring of 2024
- 129 East High students took Early College courses
- 426 East High students took Dual Credit courses
- 195 (as of April 29, 2025) East High students have earned the state Seal of Biliteracy award
- 128 (as of April 29, 2025) East High students have earned the state Commendation toward Biliteracy award

Goal # 1 Educational Equity




East Aurora High School will experience a decrease in overall referrals by 5% in the 2024-2025 school year (6156 to 5848 referrals, on track with 4454 referrals 4.28.25)

- Analyze existing discipline data on student incidents throughout the school year, identifying patterns and trends (e.g., grade level, location, offense).
- Investigate and identify the underlying reasons behind discipline incidents, such as peer conflicts.
- Collaborate with parents and guardians to address potential discipline issues or personal challenges (individual parent meetings, weekly newsletter, doubled Coffee with the Principal offerings)
- Administration will present to individual classes throughout the school year to create a positive behavioral culture and set expectations.
- Foster positive reinforcement through incentives to reward positive behaviors (e.g. participation in extracurricular events, Freshman Fest).
- Student Support Teams collaborate to provide behavioral and social-emotional supports to individuals and small groups of students.







Goal # 2 Operational Excellence



Utilize systems and resources tha promote operation excellence, efficient and fiscal accountability.

East Aurora High School will Increase Student Attendance to 85% Average Daily

Attendance. (90.11% ADA as of April 28, 2025)

- Student support teams monitor and reduce chronic absenteeism through early intervention, positive reinforcement, and family engagement.
- Utilizing counseling graduation coaches, tutoring, and mentoring programs to address academic, emotional, and social needs.
- Providing positive reinforcement and recognition to students for having good attendance (e.g. TomcatFest, tailgating parties, quarterly awards, MAP Fest, raffled off prizes).
- Implement professional development for teachers focused on evidence-based teaching strategies, differentiated instruction, and the use of data to inform instruction.

Goal # 4 Student Achievement

EDUCATIONAL EQUITY Meet the diverse needs of distudents by ensuring a softe ond incident elementor

By June of 2025, East High will increase the Freshmen On-Track rate to 87% (SY 23-24 was 81%; SY 24-25 is 85.28% as of March 10, 2025).

- Identify key baseline data in the area of freshmen on track, attendance, chronic absenteeism, D/F trends/report, and create/prioritize tasks accordingly
- Implement a system to identify students at risk of falling behind in credits by the end of the first semester of 9th grade.
- Provide targeted academic support such as tutoring, Algebra boost, and graduation coach support for students.
- Implement a school-wide system for tracking progress and celebrating academic milestones like credit completion.
- Teachers and Student Support Teams offer academic support to students.






Goal # 4 Student Achievement

By June of 2025, Cohort 2025 will have a 91% Graduation Rate.

(SY24 - 82% + summer grads= 90%; SY25 - 83% (current) plus summer grads)

- Identify key baseline data in the area of graduation rate, attendance, chronic absenteeism, D/F trends/report, AP scores, SAT/ACT scores then create/prioritize tasks accordingly.
- Use the school Monster Roster to properly identify students based on credits and graduation year and determine on-track status.
- Counselors use a variety of data sources to assist students with college & career planning to ensure students will meet graduation requirements (e.g. courses, FAFSA, ACT).
- Counselors develop and use a student monitoring system monthly to ensure that students remain on-track to graduate.
- Utilize attendance data to identify students who are in need of additional supports and interventions.







WestEd Partnership

- Worked closely with our WestEd coach to analyze this year's School Improvement Plan and focus on goals for next year.
- Implemented protocols, templates, structures for our work with our School Leadership Team.
- Helped to develop our team's guiding principles to drive areas of focus.
