Uniform Services

The uniform services oversees the South San Antonio ISD (SSAISD) campus officer assignments and the patrol division.

- Campus Officers help provide a safe and secure environment for South San Antonio ISD students, employees and visitors by deterring and disrupting criminal activities. Some of our officers are certified as mental health officers who provide emergency mental health assessments. All district officers are a vital part of their campus crisis management teams and are responsible for the safety and security of their campuses, which also requires extensive knowledge of neighboring communities.
- Patrol officers actively patrol campuses and facilities, respond to calls for service. Each patrol officer is responsible for providing a safe and secure learning and working environment for the elementary schools within their assigned area. Patrol officers assist campus officers assigned to secondary campuses when additional officers are needed.



Special Operations

The special operations is responsible for the oversight of the investigations division, police communications, courier services, training/recruiting and the joint juvenile gang intervention unit.

- Criminal Investigations Unit oversees investigations of incidents and offenses occurring on district property, personnel investigations for the human resources department, internal investigations of department officers and allegations of child abuse occurring on SSAISD property.
- Communications Center provides a communication hub for the department 8 hours a day, 5 days a week, 365 days a year, including monitoring and dispatch of security, surveillance and fire alarm systems.
- Courier Division is responsible for the collection, safeguard and delivery of district funds when they have to be transferred between SSAISD schools/facilities. The courier division is also responsible for the delivery of all court and law enforcement–related documents throughout Bexar County.
- Training Division is responsible for training all officers to meet Texas Commission on Law Enforcement-required standards and mandates, as well as for the recruitment and selection of new officers.
- Joint Juvenile Gang Intervention Unit consists of one SSAISD officer. The unit is responsible for the prevention of juvenile gang activity, and for educating students and families to prevent them becoming involved in gang activity.





Emergency Management

Emergency management staff are responsible for making sure that SSAISD is prepared for any emergency that might happen on a campus or at a facility. These staff undertake risk assessments, provide training and drills, help coordinate SSAISD's critical incident actions with local, regional, state and federal partners in the event of an emergency, and work to facilitate recovery once the event is over.





Administrative Services

- Administrative services and staff support the day-to-day operation of the department, taking reports by phone, processing crime reports and supporting our officers in the course of their work.
- To obtain a copy of a report, a request must be made in writing. The easiest way is to email ruben.elizondo@southsanisd.net. There is a standard waiting period of 10 business days to locate and prepare the report for release. You will be notified when the report is ready and when and where it can be retrieved. Please note that information related to a case still under investigation or pending court cannot be released, and some cases are ineligible for release.





Life Safety Systems

- Life Safety Systems is the name given to equipment such as fire alarm and sprinkler systems, building intruder alarms and video systems that is installed to increase the safety of building occupants.
- Life safety systems technicians are responsible for the testing and inspecting the systems installed at SSAISD facilities, and keeping them in working order. SSAISD fire alarm, building intrusion and video systems are monitored by the SSAISD dispatch center, which operates 8 hours a day, five days a week, Monday through Friday.






Triad Model - Law Enforcement

District Emergency Management





District Emergency Management







Emergency preparedness and safety are the mission of our school district. Our goal is to ensure that all students, staff and visitors are safe in our campuses and facilities.

Our prevention/mitigation measures include:

- . Police Department campus and patrol services at our elementary and secondary campuses during and after school hours.
- · Screening visitors through the Raptor system and requiring that visitors be identified.
- . Training staff and students to be observant and to report unidentified individuals and any safety concerns.
- . Conducting safety and security audits, as required by the Texas Education Code and as needed to ensure a safe learning environment.
- · A school safety and security committee that monitors compliance with local, state and federal mandates.
- . Threat assessment teams, as required by the Texas Education Code and as needed to ensure a safe learning environment.

Our preparedness efforts include: Plans

- · Multi-hazard district and campus emergency operations plans.
- . Drills in accordance with the standards of the Texas School Safety Center.
- · Coordination with federal, state and local authorities and first responders.
- · District and campus level emergency equipment and supplies.
- Mutual-aid, inter-local and other agreements to support comprehensive emergency preparedness.

Our response elements include:

- Implementation of Standard Response Protocol, e.g. Lockdown, Lockout, Evacuation, Shelter-in-Place and Hold the Bells.
- . Use of Incident Command System (ICS).
- · Effective public information/notifications systems.
- · Collaboration with local first responders.

Our recovery procedures include:

- · Plans for the emotional and physical health of students and staff after an incident.
- · After-action reviews and corrective action plans, as needed.
- Continuity of operation planning to continue school/district functions during and after an incident.
