RE: Spanish Class trip to Chicago

DATE: March 4, 2019

On Saturday, May 25, 2019 I would like to offer Vicksburg Spanish students an opportunity to experience Hispanic culture outside of the classroom. This field trip will allow the students to interact with native Spanish speaking people. Our first stop will be at the National Museum of Mexican Art. The museum is placed in the heart of the Hispanic culture of Mexico and I have allotted some time for the students to walk with their chaperone through the market and buy lunch by interacting in the market. After the zoo, we will head to Cantina Laredo to eat a Mexican cuisine for dinner. After dinner, we will head to Toyota Park to watch a Chicago Fire Soccer game. From the soccer stadium, we will depart home.

The cost per student is \$120 and this covers transportation, museum tour, the bus tour, and dinner (tip and tax included) at the restaurant. The cost will be paid by students.

We will be using B & W for charter bus transportation on this trip. Enclosed is a copy of the parent letter with itinerary, as well as a sample menu that we will get to try. I ask the Board of Education to continue to support this opportunity for Vicksburg students to apply what they have learned in the classroom to a real-life situation and experience the culture first-hand on top of what they have experienced in the classroom.

The cost is \$120 per person pending on filling the bus or not. There are only 48 s available. If we get enough interest, we can add a second bus, but it does need to fill to keep the price down. I could refund the second bus prices if it doesn't fill. Chaperones are not free and are charged the same price as the cost is per person. If money is an issue, please see me and we can see what we can do.

You MUST give the full payment to reserve your spot by April 26, 2019 (payments can be discussed). I recommend students bring about \$30-40 dollars for souvenirs and snacks that they wish to buy. We will be stopping at McDonald's for breakfast quickly on our way down. We will be selling candy through April to cover the bus driver tip and any other parking needs so that cost is not forwarded to students.
