The Student Code of Conduct shall be provided also to newly hired pro- fessional employees, newly enrolled students, and any other per- son on request.

The time for which a student is assigned to detention shall be educational purposes.	

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NOTICE TO PARENTS	When detention is used, notice shall first be given to the student's parent to inform him or her of the reason for the detention and permit arrangements for the necessary transportation of the student. Except in the case of a student who is 18 years of age or older, the detention shall not begin until the parents have been notified. The student's parents, if the student is a minor, may be required to provide transportation when the student has been assigned to detention.			
CORPORAL PUNISHMENT	The Board prohibits the use of corporal punishment in the District. Students shall not be spanked or paddled for violations of the Stu- dent Code of Conduct or the extracurricular code of conduct.			
PHYSICAL RESTRAINT	Any District employee may, within the scope of the employee's du- ties, use and apply physical restraint to a student if the employee reasonably believes restraint is necessary in order to:			
	 Protect a person, including the person using physical re- straint, from physical injury. 			
	2. Obtain possession of a weapon or other dangerous object.			
	3. Protect property from serious damage.			
	4. Remove a student refusing a lawful command of a school employee from a specific location, including a classroom or other school property, in order to restore order or to impose disciplinary measures.			
	5. Restrain an irrational student.			
EXTRACURRICULAR CODE OF CONDUCT	With the approval of the Board, principal, superintendent or desig- nee, sponsors and coaches of extracurricular activities, including interscholastic athletics and marching band, may develop and en- force standards of behavior that are higher than the District- developed Student Code of Conduct and may condition member- ship or participation in the activity on adherence to those stan- dards. Extracurricular standards of behavior may take into consid- eration conduct that occurs at any time, on or off school property. No provision of an extracurricular code of conduct shall have the effect of discriminating on the basis of sex, race, disability, religion, or ethnicity.			
	Students shall be informed of any extracurricular behavior stan- dards at the beginning of each school year or, in the case of inter- scholastic athletics and marching band, at the time the students report for workouts or practices that occur prior to the actual begin- ning of classes. Students and their parents shall sign and return to the sponsor or coach a statement that they have read the extracur-

	ricular behavior standards and consent to them as a condition of participation in the activity.
	Organizational standards of behavior of an extracurricular activity are independent of the Student Code of Conduct. Violations of these standards of behavior that are also violations of the Student Code of Conduct may result in independent disciplinary actions.
	A student may be removed from participation in extracurricular ac- tivities or may be excluded from school honors for violation of or- ganizational standards of behavior of an extracurricular activity or for violation of the Student Code of Conduct.
VIDEO/AUDIO MONITORING	Video/audio equipment shall be used for safety purposes to moni- tor student behavior on buses and in common areas on District campuses.
NOTICE	Students and parents shall be notified regarding the use of video cameras on school buses and on campuses. Signs stating that students may be video recorded shall be posted in District build- ings and on buses. Students shall not be notified when the equip- ment is turned on.
USE OF RECORDINGS	Recordings shall be reviewed on a routine basis by the principal, and evidence of student misconduct shall be documented. A stu- dent found to be in violation of the District's Student Code of Con- duct shall be subject to appropriate discipline.
ACCESS TO RECORDINGS	Recordings shall remain in the custody of the campus principal and shall be maintained as required by law. A parent or student who wishes to view a video recording in response to disciplinary action taken against the student may request such access under the pro- cedures set out by law. [See FL (LEGAL)]
