Reykjavik, Iceland - National Museum, Golden Circle, the Lava Center to learn about volcanoes and earthquakes, a visit to the geothermal hot springs, a geothermal field, and Lake Kleifarvatn.
Hvolsvollur Area - Golden Circle, the National Park, geology walk, Icelandic stables, waterfall tour, geyser tours, Viking villages and the geothermal greenhouses
2. How is this trip related to the educational program of the District? Students learn about a wide variety of different landforms and geographical features in their 6th grade science classes. Iceland is full of volcanic activity,

- geothermal pools, glaciers, geysers and plate tectonics. These tie directly into the content learned in 6th grade science. This trip will also allow students to learn about cultural diversity and provides opportunities for self exploration and discovery.

#### Hotels

Every hotel we partner with must meet our strict standards for safety, quality, and cleanliness. #### Hvolsvöllur, Iceland

Groups stay in Hvolsvöllur, about 45 minutes by bus from the Seljalandsfoss and Skógafoss waterfalls. The hotels here often feature shared amenities such as communal lounges, breakfast areas, and outdoor spaces. Rooms come with private bathrooms and feature multiple single or shared double beds. Rooms may also be on the smaller side without AC, and hotels may not have elevator access.

All Group Leaders, schools, and districts who travel with EF are automatically added as additional insureds under our \$50 million General Liability

Policy, regardless of whether or not the tour is affiliated with the school. EF's liability coverage is primary and non-contributory for covered third-party claims. The policy helps safeguard Group Leaders and their schools for covered third-party claims related to bodily injury or property damage, which includes providing a legal defense and covering legal costs for such claims. In addition, all travelers are required to sign EF's Release and Agreement which includes a release of liability of their Group Leader, school, and school board.
