Assessing the Impact of Ramp-Up to Readiness

Ramp-Up to Readiness™ schools track and share with University of Minnesota coordinators relevant measures of their efforts to prepare students for postsecondary success. The following measures are key indicators of the impact Ramp-Up has on students:

- 1. The number and percentage of students who take dual-credit courses such as AP, IB, PSEO, College-in-the- Schools, and other options
- 2. The number and percentage of students who score at the "college ready" level or above on the ACT exam or other assessments that measure college readiness
- 3. The number and percentage of high school seniors who have completed the FAFSA financial aid form
- 4. The number and percentage of students who apply to a postsecondary institution
- 5. The number and percentage of students who are admitted to a postsecondary institution
- 6. The number and percentage of students who take remedial courses at a postsecondary institution
- 7. The number and percentage of students who return to a postsecondary institution for the second year
- 8. The percentage of students that have a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- 9. The percentage of students scoring proficient on the MCAs
- 10. The percentage of seniors who graduate from high school
