The DPI Report Card - Accountability Categories

- Consists of 5 Accountability Rating Categories (DPI facilitated a reset of category score ranges this summer)
 - Significantly Exceeds Expectations 5 stars
 - Exceeds Expectations 4 stars
 - Meets Expectations 3 stars
 - Meets Few Expectations 2 stars
 - Fails to Meet Expectations 1 star
- Each school and district is scored on a 0-100 scale that corresponds to one of these categories

The DPI Report Card - Accountability Categories

- DPI facilitated a reset of category score ranges this summer)
 - Completed due to updated statewide assessments
 - Temporary shift to using 2 years of achievement data



Report Card - priority areas

- Measures 4 Priority Areas each scored on a 0 to 100 scale using 2 years of data
 - Achievement ELA and Math
 - o **Growth** ELA and Math
 - Target group outcomes (Bottom quartile) Measured through achievement, growth,
 chronic absenteeism, and graduation
 - On track to graduation Measured through chronic absenteeism, graduation, 3rd grade
 ELA, and 8th grade math
- Achievement and Growth are weighted based on percent of economically disadvantaged in the building - larger economically disadvantaged population = larger weight in the growth area

DCE Weighted Priority Areas








Priority Area Scores







The DCE Perspective

- The Report Card can be helpful:

 - Shows where we fit in comparison to Statewide districts in ELA, Math, chronic absenteeism, graduation rate, growth, etc.
- We also see the Report Card as only a single data point...
 - FastBridge/aimswebPlus
 - Insights data
 - Connections data
 - Attendance data
 - Student engagement
 - YRBS

...the rest of the story for DCE

- Pathways learning experiences IDEA, Odyssey, New Horizons, Alt. High School, Challenge, EVA, VALOR, and more
- 21 languages spoken in our district
- 139 DCE grads have earned 145 Industry Certified Credentials
- 242 Youth Apprenticeship placements from 2022-23 to present
- 231 students participated in District supported job shadow and/or post-secondary education exploratory experiences
- 87% of seniors earned college credit through DE and/or AP coursework

...the rest of the story for DCE

- Approximately 77% of DCE AP Exams taken resulted in a 3 or higher
- 100% of AP-Pre-Calculus students earned college credit. Average AP score of 4.28
- 243 NHS members and 151 NJHS members
- 25,001 documented community service hours for 10-12 students in 2024-25
- 1,050 secondary students participated in athletic co-curriculars last year
- 513 secondary students participated in academic co-curriculars last year

Theory of Action

Relation to our current work in our Professional Learning Community (PLC):

- Working with teacher teams to ensure a guaranteed and viable curriculum
- Ensuring clarity and alignment of teaching and learning
- Focusing on setting conditions of collective teacher efficacy
 - Teacher influence and ownership
 - Clear and shared Goals
 - Teacher knowledge of systems producing results
 - Staff connectedness and cohesiveness
 - Responsive leadership
 - Effective systems of intervention
