- 1. Call Meeting to Order: Vice-Chairman Lau called the board meeting to order at 7:02pm with Trustee Torgesen, and Trustee Erickson in attendance with Trustee Stoor participating in the meeting via cellular phone. Chairman Christensen had previous asked to be excused from the meeting. Also in attendance were Superintendent Molly Stein, Clerk Jonathan Balls, Principal Robert Daniel, Principal Debra Daniels, Principal Sue Hansen, four patrons and two students.
 - **1.1 Approval of Agenda**: Vice-Chairman Lau asked if any additional agenda items were needed. With no changes brought forth to the posted agenda, Trustee Erickson made a motion to approve the agenda as posted. The motion was seconded by Trustee Torgesen. By a voice vote, the motion passed unanimously.
 - **1.2 Pledge of Allegiance:** Vice-Chairman Lau invited the trustees, administration, patrons and students to join Clerk Balls in saying the Pledge of Allegiance.

With this election being a presidential election, voter turnout was very high at a 75.51% for Caribou County.

3.2 Plan going forward: The board discussed the action next steps of the facility and future bond election. After a discussion, the direction of the board is to try the bond again in the May 16th, 2017 election.
