**Lesson Plan: The Importance of Locked and Secured Doors** 

**Grade Level:** Middle and High School **Subject Area:** School Safety and Security

**Duration:** 45 minutes

# **Lesson Objectives**

By the end of the lesson, students and staff will be able to:

- Understand the importance of keeping doors locked and secured.
- Identify best practices for ensuring doors remain secured.
- Recognize their roles and responsibilities in maintaining school safety.
- Analyze real-world examples to reinforce the necessity of secure doors.

### **Materials Needed**

#### **Lesson Outline**

1. Introduction (5 minutes)

- Warm-up Question: "Why do you think keeping doors locked is important in a school setting?"
- Brief discussion to gauge initial understanding and set the stage for the lesson.

## 2. Key Concept: Importance of Locked and Secured Doors (10 minutes)

#### • Discussion Points:

- Acts as the first line of defense against intruders.
- Deters unauthorized entry and minimizes vulnerabilities.
- o Reinforces a culture of responsibility and awareness.

### 3. Real-World Examples (10 minutes)

- Case Study 1: Uvalde School Shooting (May 24, 2022)
  - 18-year-old entered through an open door.
  - o Teacher Emilia Marin used a rock to prop the door open.
  - o Outcome: 19 students and 2 teachers fatally shot, 17 injured.
  - o Reflection: Door designed to lock when shut, but it didn't function as intended.
- Case Study 2: Oxford High School Shooting (November 30, 2021)
  - 15-year-old armed with a 9mm attempted to gain access to classrooms.
  - Quick-thinking staff and students secured doors, preventing entry.

#### 4. Best Practices for Securing Doors (10 minutes)

#### Guidelines:

- Always check doors when entering or leaving a building.
- Avoid propping doors open with objects.
- Report unsecured doors or suspicious individuals immediately.
- Ensure unauthorized people check in at the office.
- Keep classroom doors closed during instruction.

### 5. Role of Staff and Students (5 minutes)

#### • Staff Responsibilities:

- Regularly inspect and secure doors.
- Educate students on safety policies.

#### • Student Responsibilities:

Follow safety rules and report security concerns.

#### Collaboration:

Emphasize that safety is a shared responsibility.

- Securing doors is essential for school safety.
