Students quickly react to any positive attention she gives them. If there is a student engaging in a negative behavior, she quickly gives them a redirection and continues with the pace of her lesson. I was able to attend one of Miss Winkelkotter's Parent Teacher Conferences. This student was very concerning and she needed to relay her intense concerns to the parent. She took a very difficult situation and communicated it very objectively. I felt like I was watching a teacher who had been in several years' worth of PTC, yet she is a first-year teacher.

Miss Winkelkotter's students KNOW that she cares about them. The relationship she has built with them allows her to teach academic and social lessons to students who are eager to learn from her!
