# CYPRESS SPRINGS HIGH SCHOOL

- Core teachers teach 5 classes
  - Common team planning period
    - 1 conference period
- Teacher load must be 130-150 students per day
- Curriculum
  - Students must have an 80 average to enroll in advanced courses




## Dual credit classes

- Taught on campus by qualified staff
- Teachers paid \$5000 per class by college
  - 30 – 35 student average class size
  - 2 dual credit classes per semester

# CYPRESS SPRINGS HIGH SCHOOL




- 8<sup>th</sup> hour for credit recovery for seniors who failed English 4, economics, or government during 1<sup>st</sup> semester
- Summer school
  - Credit recovery or acceleration - \$350 per course
  - Full day - 5 days week - 6 weeks
  - No transportation
  - Two schools team – one teaches math, science, and PE; other social studies, English and CTE



# ALTERNATIVE LEARNING CENTER

- Two tiered structure
- School day 7:20 am – 2:10 pm
- No transportation
- Intake conference/orientation time
- Bridge Class
  - Counselor conference
  - Academic assessment
  - Community service



### Lunch


- Sack/box lunch




# ALTERNATIVE LEARNING CENTER

- 100 % attendance – typically 30 days


# **ADAPTIVE BEHAVIOR CENTER**




## **□ For students who exhibit**

- An inability to learn which cannot be explained by intellectual, sensory, or health factors**
- An inability to build or maintain satisfactory interpersonal relationships with peer and teachers**
- In appropriate types of behavior or feelings**

# ADAPTIVE BEHAVIOR CENTER




- A general pervasive mood of unhappiness or depressions
- A tendency to develop physical symptoms or fears associated with personal or school problems
- Students are placed in an instructional team to provide a sense of belonging.
- Behavior management system is in place.



# WINDFERN HIGH SCHOOL (School of Choice)

- 400 students
  - Overage; credit deficient
  - Some early graduates
  - Teen parents
- Personal, family, or health issues
- Express desire for positive change




# WINDFERN HIGH SCHOOL (School of Choice)

## Junior/senior level courses

- PLATO
  - Bilingual Immersion Program
  - GED and PEP programs
  - TAKS tutorials
  - Traditional instruction
  - Ratio 12/15:1
- 9 weeks per credit – 20 credits per academic year

## (School of Choice)




### Schedule

- Flexible – up to 5 classes per day
- Early morning to late afternoon
- 2 co-op classes 45 minutes each
- 1 hour and 45 minute core classes

### Recruitment

- Application submitted
- Home campus recommends
- Director interviews possible candidates



# CARLTON VOCATION CENTER

- 30 – 40 students in vocational programs
  - Business Media Production
  - Commercial Food Service
  - Horticulture
- Also day program for autistic students
