2:265 Title IX Grievance Procedure	Annetta	Discrimination on the basis of sex, including sexual harassment, affects a student's ability to learn and an employee's ability to work.  Update: This policy and footnotes were rewritten in response to the final regulations implementing Title IX.
7:185 Teen Dating Violence Prohibited	Annetta	Engaging in teen dating violence that takes place at school, on school property, at school-sponsored activities, or in vehicles used for school-provided transportation is prohibited.  Update: Policy 2:265 updated with final Title IX regulations, therefore, this policy also reflects those changes.
7:20 Harassment of Students Prohibited	Annetta	Harassment, intimidation, and bullying is prohibited.  Update: This policy is updated to ensure alignment with the updates made to 2:260 Uniform Grievance Procedure and final regulations to Title IX.
5:100 Staff Development Program	Chris	The Superintendent or designee shall implement a staff development program to improve staff skills and maintain a high level of job performance and satisfaction. The policy outlines staff development requirements such as the Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act, Erin's Law training, In-Service Training Requirements, and additional training requirements.
		Updates: 1) Added a requirement to provide in-service training on the definition of trauma, trauma-responsive learning environments, and whole child. 2) Added that Title IX requirements for training are in accordance with 34 C.F.R. (Title 34 Code of Federal

	Regulations) and, as a result, removed 8a 8d.
