Dear Members of the State Board of Education,

My name is Kayla Dollar and I am writing this letter as an appeal regarding the decision of the Guy-Perkins School District to reject my 5-year-old son's school choice transfer to the Quitman School District. In this letter I will state my primary reasons for appealing this decision in order of importance. I am open to a hearing with your board to further discuss these reasons if needed.

My main reasons deal with safety of my son going to Quitman Public school. In 2018,

Quitman Public School installed dual purpose safety shelters in every classroom, cafeteria, and gymnasium. These safety shelters have been built and tested to withstand the forces of an EF-5 tornado. Living in Arkansas all my life, I have seen firsthand the destruction and heartache that a tornado can cause. Knowing my son would be better protected than going out into a hallway eases my mind. These same shelters are comprised of Ballistic level III steel. This means these shelters are bulletproof to the point where they would not be penetrated by multiple types of gunfire. I cannot stress enough the peace of mind that these safety shelters that Quitman Schools have implemented give me. Last year my son attended the school based Pre-K program at Quitman. When the rumors circulated about a possible school shooting occurring in

Arkansas, I felt so much better that my son would be safe in a shelter like these, as well as go to school with an on campus school resource officer.

That leads me to my next safety point, and reason for requesting the transfer to Quitman School. For the past eight years, Quitman Public school has had a school resource officer on campus to protect the students/faculty. The current school resource officer that is there has fifteen years' experience in that particular role, and five of those years at Quitman. She is specially trained to deal with situations that are specific for public schools. As to date, Guy public school does not have a resource officer. Instead they use city police officers who may or may not already be on duty off campus. This means they have to travel to the school from their current location, not to mention be possibly tied up with something else. In the event of a school shooter time would be of the essence.

My final reason for this appeal deals with the hardship it would cause my husband and I if Noah has to attend Guy. I work in Fairfield Bay which is an hour away from Guy schools. My husband works all over Arkansas with an unset schedule. Being able to drop off and pick up our son at Guy school is impossible. My mother works right across from Quitman Public School and she is able to leave work for a short time and pick him up where she can care for him until my husband and I get off of work at five that afternoon. We currently live six minutes from Quitman School, opposed to longer to get to Guy Schools.

As you can read, my main reasons deal with safety when choosing Quitman School district over Guy School district. I firmly believe that in the world we live in today, that if my son goes to school in a place where he has better chance at being safe from an unfortunate event,

then it's obvious why I chose Quitman School District. I look forward to hearing from you all and more than willing to meet with you if needed.

Please see attached a school choice appeal filed with the Department. The family appeals the Guy-Perkins School District's decision to deny school choice based on reaching its 3% cap. Because the law now allows students to retain priority for transfer until July 1 when they are denied due to the 3% cap, I will wait to schedule these appeals until July 1.

The applicable ADE rules state that districts must file any response to the appeal within ten (10) days of receipt of the appeal. You can send me any response via e-mail, or by mail to:
