## **IMPORTANT REMINDERS:**

- > Students are expected to arrive at school on time. Students will be counted tardy to school if they arrive after the school day has begun up to 9:00 A.M. After 9:00 A.M. those students' tardies will be changed to absences for the morning session.
- > Students checked out before 3:10 P.M. (Monday thru Thursday) or before 2:10 P.M. (Friday's and Early Outs) will be counted absent for the afternoon session.

#### **Office Hours**

The office hours are 7:30 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.

#### **School Hours**

- > Students are expected to arrive no earlier than 7:45 A.M. and leave no later than 3:30 P.M. Monday-Thursday unless involved in after school activities (if your child goes to an after school activity the parents must sign the child out from the pick-up room and walk their child to the campus where the activity is being held) and 2:30 P.M. on Fridays.
- ➤ Breakfast is served from 7:30 A.M. 8:45 A.M. students will go outside.
- ➤ Parents are advised that the playground/bus area is supervised from 7:45 A.M. 8:15 A.M. and 3:25 P.M. 3:40 P.M. Monday-Thursdays and 2:25 P.M. 2:40 P.M. on Fridays.
- ➤ In the event of extreme weather students will be sent to the gym until the instruction bell rings.

#### School Drop off & Dismissal

We want all students to be safe before and after school. Please be cautious when dropping your student off and picking them up. Follow the speed limit and be especially cautious for other children who may be crossing the road.

- ➤ Please be prompt when picking your child up after school. If your child has not been picked up by 4:00 P.M. (Monday Thursday) or 3:00 P.M. (Friday) we will call an emergency contact number on the students list. In the event we cannot reach anybody, Child Protection Services will be called.
- ➤ Please check the calendar for early dismissal dates. In the event of an emergency dismissal radio stations will be notified for broadcast. Please prepare in advance for emergency dismissals.
- ➤ Messages after 2:00 P.M. cannot be guaranteed on regular school days and 1:00 P.M. on early out days.

#### 100% PERFECT ATTENDANCE:

Students must be in the classroom by 8:15 A.M. after this time a tardy slip will be given.

Guardians it is recommended that no check-outs occur before 3:10 pm (Monday -Thursday) and 2:10 pm (Friday or any early out).

School Related and Special Circumstance absences will not count against student (up to 3 days).

#### 98% GREAT ATTENDANCE:

#### Student can have up to 4 absences.

Student is counted AM tardy absent after 9:00AM and PM absent after 12:00 PM.

Students can be checked out during the day for no longer than 2 hours and must return before the end of the school day.

School Related and Special Circumstance absences will not count against student (up to 3 days).

#### 95% SUKAPII ATTENDANCE:

#### Students can have up to 9 absences

Students counted AM tardy absent after 9:00AM and PM absent after 12:00 PM.

Students can be checked out during the day for no longer than 2 hours and must return at end of the school day.

School Related and Special Circumstances absences will not count against student (up to 3 days).

Students who receive a referral during the quarter may not be allowed to participate in school related functions (i.e. classroom/ school wide field trips)

Students who reach this level may be suspended for up to 10 days and may be recommended for change in

placement

**PARENT OPTION**: The parent/guardian has the option of sitting in class with their child instead of having the student serve OSS. (Equivalent to OSS)

#### **PRINCIPAL OPTION** can include the following:

A. OSS (depending on severity) D. Timeout with principal

B. Buddy Room E. Calming Area

C. Lunch Detention F. Change of placement **Steps Level:** Students will be placed on this level when misbehavior in the classroom has progressed through the steps in a teacher's classroom management plan and has reached the level of a referral. Placement on this level is for less severe but consistent infractions.

<u>Severe Level</u>: Students are automatically placed on this level when serious misbehavior occurs and/or has completed the steps level. Severe referrals require the student is sent directly to the principal. Serious misbehavior includes, but is not limited to:

- Bullying - Fighting - Instigating a fight

- Insubordination - Harassment (any) - Vandalism

- Overt defiance - Cussing

**Extreme Level:** Students are placed on this level after progressing through the steps in the Severe Level. The following behaviors result in immediate progression to this level:

- Failure to comply with principal request
- Assault on a student or staff member
- Selling, possession, use, or distribution of drugs, alcohol, or tobacco
- Weapons (anything used with intent to harm another person)

IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE STATE AND FEDERAL LAW AND THE GUN FREE SCHOOLS ACT ANY STUDENT WHO BRINGS A FIREARM ONTO SCHOOL PROPERTY SHALL BE EXPELLED FOR A PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAN ONE CALENDAR YEAR UNLESS MODIFIED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, UPON A RECOMMENDATION FROM THE SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT.

Physical assault of a staff member will not be tolerated. Students who assault a staff member will immediately progress to the Extreme Level on the Administrative Support Plan and may be recommended for expulsion

#### **BULLYING / HARASSMENT**

Bullying / Harassment will be treated in the same manner as assault or a fight and will begin on the Severe Level of the Behavior Action Plan.

#### FIGHTING / INSTIGATING A FIGHT

Instigating a fight will be treated in the same manner as an actual Assault or Fight and will begin on the Severe Level of the Behavior Action Plan.

#### **ASSAULT**

Less severe cases of assault will fall under the Severe Level of the Administrative Support Plan and progress from there. Serious offenses of Assault will fall under the Extreme Level of the Behavior Action Plan.

The student will be placed on the Extreme Level of the Administrative Support Plan.

We as a District follow the Montana Behavior Initiative (MBI) and KW/VINA Elementary is proactive opposed to reactive.
