**Background:** In December of 2009, the State Board of Education revised Oregon Administrative Rules regarding essential skills, diploma, modified diploma, extended diploma, alternative certificates and literacy instruction. These changes further established that an ESD shall award diplomas.

- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Superintendent is directed to bring new Board Policy IKFB Graduation Exercises back for second reading and adoption at the next regular meeting of the Board.

## **Graduation Exercises**

All students in good standing who have successfully completed the requirements for a senior high school diploma, a modified diploma, certificate of completion or a certificate of attendance may participate in graduation exercises.
