Effective July 1, 2011 we are required to abide by the provision of section 205 of the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 (Public Law 11-296). School food authorities (SFA's) participating in the National School Lunch Program are required to provide the same level of support for lunches served to students who are not eligible for free or reduced priced lunches (i.e. paid lunches) as they are for lunches served to students eligible for free lunches. We are not required to increase breakfast prices; but, at \$1.00 at the Middle School and High School (if you factor in labor costs) we are losing money on most meals served. I am recommending we keep the Elementary breakfast prices the same and increasing all other student meals by \$.25. This should allow our department to operate independently of the General Operating Fund. We have a higher concentration of low-income students at the Elementary campus and keeping the breakfast price the same will help lessen the impact the increased lunch price. The last time regular priced meals were increased was June 11, 2007.
