Presentations/ Recognitions Each year in conjunction with the Texas Association of School Administrators/Texas Association of School Board Convention, the Texas Art Education Association hosts a display featuring original artwork from Texas public school children in grades PreK through 12. This fall Denton ISD had seven students from various elementary campuses that were honored. The students were from Bell, Borman, Cross Oaks, Pecan Creek, and Stephens Elementary Schools as well as Harpool and Rodriguez Middle Schools.

The Texas Association of School Psychologists (TASP) recently named Francis Chen, Denton ISD Licensed Specialist in School Psychology, Outstanding School Psychologist for the state of Texas. Mr. Chen is also a long-time member of both the TASP and the National Association of School Psychologists (NASP). Mr. Chen has provided psychological services in

Denton ISD for the past 16 years.

COVID-19 Update Dr. Matt Richardson provided the Board of Trustees with a COVID-19 update. Denton County currently has 2,807 active cases, 12,507 recoveries, 5 deaths with a total 16,437 cases. Cases are trending upward and there is a 2-week delay from the point of a person being tested before it is reflected on the Denton County Health departments system. Dr. Richardson stated there is an increase in community spread and individuals need to continue to wear masks.

Susannah O'Bara reviewed the updated student numbers for ConnectedLearning students, F2F students and the average class size for F2F students by High School zone. The largest F2F class size averages 22 students.

Discussion of HB3: Additional Days School Year for 2021-2022 Susannah O'Bara, Area Superintendent provided the Board with information regarding the options provided under HB3: Additional school days for targeted campuses. HB 3 provides ½ day funding for up to 30 additional school days, beyond 180 minimum days on approved calendar. To achieve 180 days on the approved calendar, 8 additional days would be necessary. To allow for alignment in holidays and breaks throughout the year, the proposal considers an additional 19 days eligible for ADSY. Teacher contracts would allow for an additional 25 days. ADSY could provide extended services to students and increased pay to teachers at no additional cost to district.

Discussion of Legislative Priorities in Preparation of the 87th Legislative Session Dr. Gwen Perkins, Area Superintendent, and Deron Robinson, General Counsel reviewed what had been discussed with the Board of Trustees at previous Board meetings and continue work to outline the district legislative priorities for the 87th Legislative Session. The legislative priorities for the Denton ISD are aligned to Board goals as the Trustees advocate for our students and public education in Texas.

Required Testing Report Lyneille Meza, Director of Assessment Data provided the Board with the required student testing in Denton ISD. Student assessment is required to measure learning, determine readiness for curriculum, and entry into special programs. This information keeps the Trustees well-informed of the testing requirements for students.

Special Education Report

Debbie Roybal, Executive Director of Special Education provided the Board of Trustees with a report of special education services and programs that are provided to 3,714 students with disabilities currently enrolled in Denton ISD during the 2020-2021 school year. he goal of the department is to provide training, coaching, leadership and guidance to ensure that students with

disabilities are educated in the least restrictive environment with supplemental aide and supports or in specialized programs to meet each student's individual needs. Training and support are provided to general special education teachers, specialized program teachers, paraprofessionals, campus administrators, support staff, and others.

For 2020 the District's special education percentage reached 11.8%. Currently, 82% of students with disabilities are learning in a general education setting with supplemental supports and services or accommodations.

2020-2021-1st Reporting Period Attendance Report Angela Ricks, Director of Student Support Services provided the campus and district ADA percentages for the 1st Reporting Period of the 2020-2021 school year (August 26, 2020 through October 2, 2020) and to compare this data to prior years. Our current ADA for the first reporting period is 95.91%. This percentage will increase once the RAU absence code becomes active in eSchoolPlus. For this school year, monitoring attendance while students have the option for face-to-face and remote instruction has posed some challenges for the entire learning community. We have taken this first reporting period to provide education to students and parents regarding the "new" way of monitoring attendance. The truancy prevention measures used in Reporting Period 1 include, but are not limited to; automated phone calls, flyers, student and parent communications, warning letters (314), online truancy class referrals (53), counselor referrals (217), attendance contracts (20), campus consequences (702), and home visits (96). The biggest change from previous years is the increase number of counselor referrals, campus consequences and home visits.

Head Start Annual 644 Financial Compliance Report This report is provided to the Board of Trustees as a summary of the Ann Windle School for Young Children (AWSYC) Head Start Administrative Requirements and Standards from section 644 of the Head Start Act. Annually, each Head Start Agency must report the following information from the most recently concluded fiscal year:

- The total amount of public and private funds received and the amount from each source.
- An explanation of budgetary expenditures and proposed budget for the fiscal year.
- The results of the most recent review of the financial audit.

AWSYC is funded by a Federal Grant in the amount of \$1,393,945. The award for 2019-2020 reflects a COLA (cost of living adjustment) increase over the previous year in the amount of \$23,876. The grant requires a local match of 20% or \$348,486. A total from all sources during the 2019-2020 school year for matching dollars is \$991,122. The decrease in match was due to the impact of Covid-19.

As a result of AWSYC designation as a Head Start Program, Denton ISD was able to serve 193 students in a full day Head Start program implemented by 11 highly qualified/certified, degreed teachers.
