LETTER OF AGREEMENT

Roles and Responsibilities of Each Partner in the Regional Safe Schools Program

The Kane County Regional Office of Education will continue to serve as the administrative agent for the Regional Safe Schools Program to serve qualified students during the 2018-2019 school year. Participating districts include U-46, 101,129, 131, 300, 301, 302, 303 and 304.

Each participating school district agrees to the following:

- 1. Students enrolled in the program must also be enrolled in their home school district.
- 2. Students enrolled in the program must be placed through an administrative transfer conducted by both the sending school and receiving program.
- 3. Students enrolled in the program must meet entrance criteria stated in the Safe Schools Act.
- 4. Students enrolled in the program must have an Alternative Education Plan. At a minimum, the student, parent/guardiant, home school administrator, and the program administrator should be involved in producing the Alternative Education Plan.
- 5. Districts agree that all school records shall be maintained and kept confidential.
- 6. Districts agree that any special education services provided prior to enrollment in the Safe Schools Program will follow those students.
