Goal One – Learning

Winter benchmarking season is upon us! This month, our students will take assessments to monitor their progress, such as the winter MAP test, ELA & Math common assessments, and update our IXL & Amira scores. Aimsweb+ testing was completed before winter break. I meet with teachers and grade level teams to evaluate this data and ensure our staff is meeting the needs of all of our students, specifically during WIN time. Our teams are re-evaluating their practices and determining how to better differentiate for all students. This includes looking at neighboring schools to learn how we can improve. In addition to the new winter benchmarking, our coaches joined me for a Zoom with an ISBE data specialist to further analyze our IAR scores and identify areas for improvement. Our building leaders will continue to analyze this data to adjust instruction to ensure our students are on track.

Goal Two – Whole Student Development

This month, our new Student Leadership Team begins its work! We had over 50 applications, and now have almost 20 new student leaders ready to share their ideas to improve Prairieview. We're lucky to have so many great students who took the time to take ownership of their school and brainstorm new ideas. Also, this month, we'll have some student-run clubs get up and running. These clubs are started by students who have a passion for physics, logic puzzles, research, and more! Thank you to our teachers for working with students to foster a sense of community and ownership over school clubs and activities.
